



For your safety and benefit these reasonable rules will be expected and followed:

- A**ttitude ~ Christian conduct and character is expected at all times.
- T**ime ~ You will be expected to follow the schedule.
- M**issing ~ You will not be permitted to leave the grounds except for prior scheduled excursions.
- O**n & Off ~ Your clothing should be of a modest nature. The standards of the world are not the standards of Lake Aurora. This especially includes swimsuits. If clothing is inappropriate or immodest, you may be asked to change.
- S**ickness ~ All sickness and accidents must be reported to your counselor or camp nurse promptly. Lake Aurora has a modest accident insurance policy covering each camper.
- P**romotion ~ Shirts and clothing promoting alcohol or tobacco products, suggestive statements, grotesque scenes, or other graphics not consistent with a Christian environment may not be worn or displayed. This will include bumper stickers & signs on vehicles.
- H**ealthy ~ Tobacco, alcoholic beverages, and illegal items & other such products are not permitted and may result in dismissal.
- E**ducation & Electronics ~ To maximize the camp experience ----Smart devices such as watches, music/dvd, gaming devices/players, radios, Tablets/lpads, etc. **should not be** brought.
- R**ights ~ While at camp your rights will be determined by The Golden Rule of Christ. Christianity is and always has been based on one "denying one's self". This principle will affect what you say, what you do, what is expected of you, & what you can expect from others.
- E**mergency ~ Parents/Guardians will be notified of any emergency. Cell phones **are not** permitted for campers. They will be removed if brought and returned on closing day.

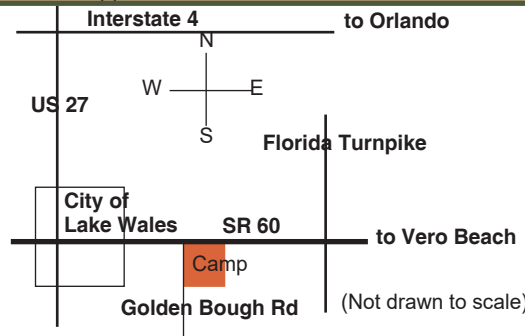
PLEASE NOTE:

CHECK IN DAY...

Enter campus by following either the arrows for EXPRESS Lakeside or the **RED arrows for Balance Due Check in**

➔ If you have paid in FULL- follow the **Express**, signs to the Lakeside *housing areas*. (Girls to the south - line forms at Quails Roost Shelter, Boys to the east - under the 'Steel Tent'.)

-- OR --

➔ If have a 'balance due' *go to Ministry Center, first paved entrance of campus*. Campers will be given a "pass" to enter housing selection areas. **You cannot select a bed without this pass.** *Please have the balance due that is stated in your confirmation letter when checking in at Ministry Center.*

LAKESIDE HOUSING SELECTION AREA


No early check ins. Please complete:

- Health Screening Form - Pickup at each housing sign up. (Recent illness/temperature taken/signed by adult)
- Additional Spending Money Account Envelope - available at housing (Can also add money online or at camp office)

OTHER CHECK IN STEPS...

- ★ Housing check-in stations form one line per gender. Quails Roost Shelter (girls) and the Steel Tent (boys). No early check ins. First come, first served for bed selections (except for prior Program Director assignments). Please arrive together if requesting same dorm. 14-16 camper beds depending on staff bed needs. High School uses both campuses for housing but check in is on Lakeside.
- ★ Each camper will have their temperature taken and asked *recent* medical history questions prior to selecting beds. (No one with a temp of 100.4° or higher will be admitted into camp) **Please double check for lice.** Same policy as schools - no nits. **Please - NO SICK CAMPERS.**
- ★ Each camper must be processed through Housing Assignments BEFORE entering dorm.
- ★ NO swim tests are given at these grade levels and campers should know their own swimming abilities
- ★ Pre-ordered T-shirts can be picked up in the Lower Deck or wait for orientation. Label immediately. Not responsible for lost shirts.
- ★ Camp begins with tolling of camp bell at 5 pm. Lakeside campers wait in dorms for bed check then report to Chapel with your dorm group. Hillside campers report to Lakeside Steel Tent first.

Please remember...

 Turn in all medication to the camp nurse (**Original containers required** - "daily organization system" must be supported with original Rx). Infirmary located at end of Lakeside circle drive.

CHECK IN TIME* - 4-5 PM

Parking available in open field of Lakeside and in front of girls dorms for unloading. Leave baggage in vehicles until housing assignments are complete.

This program will use the entire campus, Hillside and Lakeside. Housing assignment stations are all on Lakeside on check in day and you can choose which campus/cabins you would like to be in.

2:00 pm FRIDAY - Enter campus at the entrance off Golden Bough for the campus your camper was housed. Each driver will receive a "camper check out card". Please complete with the names of campers riding in vehicle and turn in to camp staff upon departure at camp gate.

CLOTHING SUGGESTIONS

MODEST casual clothes are suggested. Shorts and other casual type clothing are appropriate provided they are of modest nature. (**See rules 5 and 6**). If modesty is questioned, **you may be asked to change by counselors or the Program Director.** Short shorts, skimpy tops and exposed undergarments are not appropriate. The standards of the world are not the standards at Lake Aurora.

Include some clothing that can get "messy". The senior high campers usually treat the dinner meal as "special" and dress in nice casual clothes. Thursday dinner will be extra nice.

In swimming, **if modesty is questioned**, you should have a **dark** colored T-shirt to wear over your swimsuit (Some suits will need a dark t-shirt coverup). Or shorts over 'cheeky' bottoms. Please use discretion.

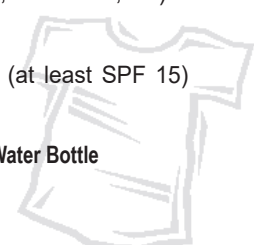


WHAT TO BRING...

SPENDING MONEY ACCOUNT- CANTEEN/STORE CARD

The "Canteen Card" and "Bank" are also referred to as - the "Camper's Store Account" online. High School campers may also use cash. No camper credit cards.

Each camper will have a "Camper Store Account" for their purchases and offerings at camp. The account is initially opened with \$5 as part of registration. It can also be placed in a "canteen" envelope on check-in day. The average amount of spending money we suggest is approximately \$40 based on the length of the program. At the end of the program, unused funds greater than \$10 may be requested for return on closing day at the T-Shirt Shoppe on the Lakeside campus. Remaining funds less than \$10 are automatically donated to the specific mission of the week.

The "Store Account" can be used for Canteen snack items, T-shirt Shoppe, camp photo, leather crafts and mission offering. Funds can be deposited in the "Store Account" online, please complete a Canteen Envelope at check-in depositing it at the Housing Assignment venue.

Each camper may purchase two items at canteen which is open twice a day. The most they can spend at any one time is about \$1.50-3. The T-shirt Shoppe with Lake Aurora items range from 50 cents to \$38.

Add additional funds to this account while your child is at camp through the "Parents Portal" by using your email and password. After logging in, click on the "parents" tab at the top and click "View Itineraries". Click the camper's program and click the "Store Account" link on the right. Contact the camp office for questions about your online account.
